### Successful year for D of E students

It's been a very successful year for Duke of Edinburgh awards. 31 of our departing Year 11s received their Bronze Award (the largest number since 2015!) and a whole new cohort rose to the challenge of the award, by starting their DofE journey.

68 students took part in their practice expeditions and assessment weekends that make up a quarter of the award. The practices were held locally, with a walk to Crosby for most groups offering an opportunity to practice navigation skills and campcraft, by erecting their tents during their lunch break. Students worked together in teams and showed a competitive streak with their ambition to get there first. Despite the glorious weather, lessons were learned in terms of what to bring in their bags and how much endurance they were going to need to complete their assessment expeditions in the Lake District.

For the assessment expeditions, all groups managed to get up to Eskdale in the Lake District to put all of those skills to the test. They completed two six hour walks in two days, and navigated across challenging terrain in an unfamiliar setting. All students displayed resilience. They managed to cook evening meals that ranged from pot noodles and pasta to ostrich steaks, with s'mores and hot chocolate for dessert. Although some groups found the navigation hard, with a couple of wrong turns taken along the way, the skills that were developed during each expedition showed their commitment to self-improvement and overcoming adversity. Now that they are all home safe and sound, we all wish them luck with their Skills, Volunteering and Physical sections over the summer, which will allow them to complete the award in the next academic year.
