This year, the Year 7 Science Project was centred around three key themes: Chemistry – Particle Theory, Physics – Forces and Motion, and Biology – Cells. Students were given the opportunity to showcase their creativity and scientific understanding by constructing a 3-D model or conducting a scientific investigation based on any of these disciplines.

The enthusiasm and dedication displayed by all Year 7 students were truly commendable. Each participant worked diligently on their projects, demonstrating their knowledge and passion for science through innovative models and insightful reports. The projects covered a wide range of scientific concepts, from intricate cell models and whole anatomical construction of a cat, force experiments including constructing working catapults to detailed representations of particle theory.

To celebrate their hard work, we held a special exhibition in the main hall, where students proudly displayed their projects. This event provided a fantastic opportunity for students, teachers, and visitors to engage with the work on display, fostering discussions about scientific principles and creativity.


Sixth Form's Close Shave for Macmillan

Year 9 and 10 Girls Shine at South Sefton Football Tournament


